Responsible for the management and integration of first responder teams across the country.


The team support nearly 300 first responder schemes and just over 3,000 volunteers around Ireland

COMMUNITY FIRST RESPONDER (CFR) GROUPS



Community First Responders (CFR) are volunteers who are trained to attend certain types of emergency calls in the area where they live or work.

Their aim is to reach a potential life threatening emergency in the first vital minutes before the ambulance crew arrives.

Community First Responder (CFR) volunteers are supporting International Overdose Awareness Day 2024 by hosting six CPR and intranasal naloxone demonstrations in communities on Saturday the 31st of August 2024.


These will facilitate training members of the public in the lifesaving skill of recognising and responding to an opioid overdose, administering CPR and how to use intranasal naloxone.
